MEETING NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that the following meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority will take place at <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>March 21</u>, <u>2023</u> in the Board Room of the Authority, 1240 West Sixth Street, Cleveland, OH 44113 for consideration of the listed items and such other items that may properly come before the Board and be acted upon. This meeting will be live streamed on RTA's Board Page <u>www.RideRTA.com/board</u> via the meeting date for staff and members of the public. Members of the public may attend in person.

Based on Centers for Disease Control ("CDC") guidance to avoid crowded places where you cannot stay 6 feet away from others and Ohio Department of Public Health advice regarding congregating and social distancing, as well as RTA's interest in protecting community and employee health and safety, RTA Board Room and Meeting Room 1 capacity is limited to thirty-six (36) people to allow for social distancing. To accommodate members of the public, RTA will limit the number of staff permitted in the Board Room. All persons entering RTA's Main Office Building ("MOB") at 1240 West 6th Street are required to maintain a distance of six feet or more from other individuals who are not members of their family or household.

As a result of a federal court order on April 18, 2022, the CDC's January 29, 2021 order requiring masks on public transportation conveyances and at transportation hubs is no longer in effect. The CDC continues to recommend that people wear masks in indoor public transportation settings at this time. As a result, GCRTA recommends, but will not require, that members of the public wear a mask/face covering.

The meeting was called to order at 9:49 a.m. There were five (5) board members present.

It was advised that notice of this meeting have been posted more than twenty-four hours in advance of the meeting, that the usual notification has been given the news media and other interested persons, and that all requirements of the Ohio Revised Code and Rules and Bylaws of this Board regarding notice of meeting have been complied with.

Minutes

President Lucas stated that the minutes from the January 31, 2023 Board Meeting had been previously distributed and reviewed, and asked whether there were any additions and/or corrections. There were no corrections. The minutes were approved.

Public Comments – Agenda Items

- Shawn Freeman He's representing the paratransit community. At last month's meeting, Shalida
 Dobbins requested updates to the website to make it more assessable (keyboard, reservation and
 cancelation line). Rides must be made a week in advance. She requested a meeting or response
 from the Board, but she didn't hear back.
 - Ms. Birdsong Terry asked him to follow-up with Nick Davidson, Director of Paratransit who is here today. We have a new staff member who will be working with IT on the ADA page. The website is under review. Ms. McCall mentioned that this is also a medical industry issue.
- 2. <u>Loh</u> She agreed with the statements made about paratransit. Doctors can cancel appointments with short notice. No shows end up on rider's records if they can't cancel the ride in time.
- 3. Chris Martin He is the Chair of Clevelanders for Public Transit (CPT). Shalida Dobbins is the Vice Chair of CPT. He asked Mayor Biasiotta to email him at info@clefortransit.org with his main concern for his city and he will tell him how better bus service is a part of that solution. CPT fights for the restoration of service cut by RTA. RTA must be bold and provide excellent public transit, Additional funding must be found.

Mayor Biasiotta said his interest on the Board is more global. He is a big advocate for public transit. He rode RTA to CSU and downtown for 20 years. His uncle was an operator and his dad rode RTA for over 40 years. His interest is to provide the best mobility for everyone in the county. It's important for jobs, the disabled, etc. The Board must make tough decisions to adhere to the budget. It requires a partnership with the state, county and federal government. He wants to use his connections to improve the funding. He asked Mr. Martin to tell him where the funds can be used more efficiently.

- 4. <u>Airric Stewart</u> He repeated his proposal to reinstate the 15A. His proposal will connect riders to libraries, schools, retail and medical facilities.

Secretary-Treasurer's Report

Kay Sutula, Director of the Office of Management and Budget, gave the presentation in Mr. Gautam's absence. The U.S. annual inflation rate has increased from 2.5% in January 2020 to 9.1% in June 2022. Since June the inflation rate has been falling. At the end of January 2023, inflation is down to 6.4% and is expected to fall the remainder of the year. The Federal Reserve raised interest rates in December 2022 to its highest level in 15 years to fight against inflation. The Federal Open Market Committee increased interest rates to 4.43%.

The U.S. unemployment rate was 3.5% in December 2022, down from 3.7% in November 2022. The Ohio and County unemployment rate is preliminary and not seasonally adjusted. The Ohio rate remains steady at 4.2% in December 2022. Cuyahoga County dropped to 3.5% in December. Looking at the five largest metropolitan statistical areas (MSA). These are not seasonally adjusted. For December 2022, the rates are preliminary from the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Cleveland is 3.5%, down from 4.2%. Toledo is 3.9%, up from 3.3%. Dayton is 3.5%, up from 3.1%. Cincinnati rose to 3.1%. Columbus rose to 3.1%.

January ridership was 37% above January 2022 levels. Compared to January 2022, ridership increased in all modes. January ridership was 1.68 million compared to 1.22 million in January 2022. Passenger fares for January 2023 was \$1.8 million or 18.1% above January 2022 which was \$1.5 million and 39.6% lower than January 2019. February 2023 sales tax receipts (for November 2022 activity) is 9.2% higher than February 2022. YTD it is 6.1% higher than 2022.

General Manager/CEO Report

India L. Birdsong Terry, General Manager, CEO gave the report. Transit Employee Appreciation Day will be celebrated, Friday, March 24. Staff held several events for February Heart Health Month. A DEI&B Leadership Retreat was held February 3 in the Board Room. Ms. Birdsong Terry was a judge for the Accelerate 2023 competition. The Connectworks Ribbon Cutting was held February 16 at the Southgate Transit Center. Several partners were in attendance including Senator Matt Dolan, County Executive Chris Ronayne, Solon Mayor Edward Kraus and others. The next set of proposals are due March 30 for the second pilot.

The new MetroHealth Line sponsored CNG buses are on the street. A bus was out front for touring. Twelve of the 20 buses are in service. Staff testified in Columbus on projects that were funded for rail cars, buses, light rail track replacement, microtransit and Baby on Board. Several recommendations for ODOT TRAC competitive grants are in draft form or currently in progress including 25Connects/MetroHealth BRT and Light Rail Track Replacement. Final recommendations are expected March 29, 2023. Ohio Loves Transit Day was February 7. Several staff members met with Senators in Columbus. The General Managers internal update is going digital to reduce paper. The 2022 Annual Report video was played.

Public Comments – public transit related items

- 1. <u>Chris Martin</u> He thanked the Board members and staff who attended the CPT Transit Equity Day rally and Ride Along. RTA asked for status quo funding from the State. CPT believes that Ohio is unconstitutionally governed by a radical right wing, super majority which has for years openly displayed its contempt for cities like Cleveland and Cuyahoga County. The State and Federal government is not a sustainable funding source.
- Loh The reason RTA does not have enough workers is due to less training. The website needs
 work. The county, city and State websites are all ADA insufficient. She requested the CAC and
 Transit Ambassadors work to improve the service and tackle funding issues.
 - Ms. Welch added that the leadership at RTA is really being mindful of the level of engagement with the community and riders. CPT is doing amazing work engaging with the public. She hopes for synergy between the customer surveys, RTA and CPT.
- Airric Stewart He repeated his proposal to reinstate the 15A. His proposal will connect riders to libraries, schools, retail and medical facilities. The customer surveys have not worked. He's gotten disconnected several times from the RTA Community Connection Line, 216-621-9500. He hasn't received a call back from Mr. Rivera in the Telephone Information Department.

President Lucas said all of Mr. Stewart's concerns have been reviewed by the Service Management department. He hasn't had any issues with the Community Connection Line but thanked Mr. Stewart for his feedback.

- 1.0 PURPOSE/SCOPE: This action will allow the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority ("Authority") to enter into a contract for an applicant tracking system.
- 2.0 DESCRIPTION/JUSTIFICATION: The Authority has an immediate need to attract, identify, and hire qualified employees. In support of this effort, the Authority is seeking an applicant tracking system, which is a software as a service-based solution that will standardize and automate recruitment, hiring, and onboarding processes. The current processes exist in several different disjointed and manual systems. The applicant tracking system will maximize productivity by automating administrative tasks, streamlining the recruitment cycle, reducing time-to-hire and cost-to-hire, and offering a better applicant experience.
- 3.0 PROCUREMENT BACKGROUND: The Request for Proposals ("RFP") was posted on the Authority's Procurement website and advertised in local newspapers. Twenty-two (22) interested parties downloaded the solicitation, and four (4) responsive proposals were received on October 5, 2022. After evaluation by a panel of Authority employees in accordance with established Procurement Department policies and procedures, the proposal from UKG, Inc., to provide an applicant tracking system, was determined to be the most advantageous to the Authority, price and all other factors considered. After negotiations, a contract amount not to exceed \$347,000.00 for a three-year period was agreed upon. The total amount includes a \$32,000.00 one-time fixed-fee for implementation and training. In addition, an annual fee of \$105,000.00 was negotiated for each year of the three-year term. This amount is approximately 24% below the estimate for this project.

A cost analysis has been performed, and the Procurement Department has determined the price to be fair and reasonable to the Authority.

- 4.0 AFFIRMATIVE ACTION/ DBE BACKGROUND: All Affirmative Action requirements have been met. A 0% DBE goal was established for this procurement due to the lack of certified DBE firms.
- 5.0 POLICY IMPACT: Does not apply.
- 6.0 ECONOMIC IMPACT: This procurement shall be payable through the General Fund, Management Information Services Department Budget, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$347,000.00 for a three-year period.
- 7.0 ALTERNATIVES: Reject this offer. Rejection of this offer would delay the Authority's ability to attract, identify, and hire qualified employees.

- 8.0 RECOMMENDATION: This procurement was discussed by the Board of Trustees at the March 7, 2023 Organizational, Services and Performance Monitoring Committee meeting. It is recommended that the offer of UKG, Inc. be accepted and the resolution passed authorizing the General Manager, Chief Executive Officer to enter into a contract.

AUTHORIZING CONTRACT NO. 2022-088 WITH UKG, INC. TO PROVIDE AN APPLICANT TRACKING SYSTEM FOR A THREE-YEAR PERIOD IN A TOTAL CONTRACT AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$347,000.00 (GENERAL FUND, MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SERVICES DEPARTMENT BUDGET)

WHEREAS, the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority ("Authority") is seeking to utilize an applicant tracking system which is a software as a service-based solution that will standardize and automate recruitment, hiring, and onboarding processes; and

WHEREAS, UKG, Inc., headquartered in Weston, Florida, submitted a proposal to provide the application tracking system for a three-year period in a total contract amount not to exceed \$347,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the General Manager, Chief Executive Officer deems the offer of UKG, Inc., as negotiated, to be in the best interest of the Authority and recommends acceptance thereof by the Board of Trustees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the offer of UKG, Inc., to provide an applicant tracking system, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Section 2. That the General Manager, Chief Executive Officer of the Authority be and she is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with UKG, Inc. to provide an applicant tracking system for a three-year period.

Section 3. That said contract will be funded through the General Fund, Management Information Services Department Budget, in a total negotiated contract amount not to exceed \$347,000.00 for a three-year period.

Section 4. That said contract shall be binding upon and an obligation of the Authority contingent upon future funding, compliance by the contractor to the Specifications and Addenda, if any, the Affirmative Action Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees, bonding and insurance requirements and all applicable laws relating to contractual obligations of the Authority.

Section 5. That the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority's Board of Trustees expects that UKG, Inc. will attempt to exceed the 0% DBE goal assigned to this procurement.

Section 6. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

- 1.0 PURPOSE/SCOPE: This action will allow the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority ("Authority") to enter into a contract for On-Call Architect/Engineer Services for a period of 24 months.

- 1.0 PURPOSE/SCOPE: This action will approve a new three-year Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") with the Fraternal Order of Police/Ohio Labor Council, Inc. ("FOP/OLC"). The term of the new agreement will be from March 1, 2023 through February 28, 2026. The new CBA describes the "Conditions of Employment" for employees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority ("GCRTA") covered by the FOP/OLC bargaining unit, which generally includes police officers, sergeants, dispatchers and security officers as well as the incorporation of Transit Ambassadors through a Memorandum of Understanding with the FOP/OLC. Employees covered by the new CBA number is approximately 5% of the GCRTA's approximate 2,200 active positions.
- 2.0 DESCRIPTION/JUSTIFICATION: The previous CBA with the FOP/OLC expired at midnight on February 28, 2023 but continued in effect until this new CBA was negotiated and approved. Negotiations for a new agreement commenced on December 21, 2022. Six joint bargaining sessions occurred during January and February of 2022 between representatives of the FOP/OLC and the GCRTA. These negotiations culminated in a tentative agreement being reached between the parties on February 24, 2023 for a new three-year CBA. The CBA was approved by union membership on March 3, 2023.
- 3.0 PROCUREMENT BACKGROUND: Does not apply.
- 4.0 DBE/AFFIRMATIVE ACTION BACKGROUND: Does not apply.
- 5.0 POLICY IMPACT: The subject action has important policy implications, principally in the areas of cost control and service quality.
- 6.0 ECONOMIC IMPACT: The estimated costs and savings associated with the major economic provisions of the new agreement will be provided to the Board of Trustees.
- 7.0 ALTERNATIVES: Not approve the new three-year agreement as proposed. Management would be required to direct the staff to return to the bargaining table with the FOP/OLC to seek further changes or revisions.
- 8.0 RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the proposed new three-year labor agreement with the FOP/OLC.

APPROVING A NEW THREE-YEAR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT COVERING CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT WITH THE FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE/OHIO LABOR COUNCIL, INC.

WHEREAS, the previous Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") between the Fraternal Order of Police/Ohio Labor Council, Inc. ("FOP/OLC") and the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority ("GCRTA"), established on March 1, 2020, expired at midnight on February 28, 2023 but continued in effect until a new agreement was negotiated; and

WHEREAS, collective bargaining between representatives of the FOP/OLC and GCRTA has produced a new CBA covering the period from March 1, 2023 through February 28, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the members of the FOP/OLC have approved the new CBA.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") for employees represented by the Fraternal Order of Police/Ohio Labor Council, Inc. ("FOP/OLC") be and it is hereby approved incorporating the changes, modifications, additions, and deletions, as negotiated by the representatives of the FOP/OLC and the GCRTA to become effective retroactive to March 1, 2023, and continue through February 28, 2026.

Section 2. That said contract will be funded through the General Fund.

Section 3. That the CBA, as amended, be and hereby is approved, and the General Manager, Chief Executive Officer is authorized to execute said agreement.

Section 4. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
