AUTHORIZING THE SUPPORT FOR A GRANT APPLICATION BY THE CITY OF CLEVELAND FOR THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION BEYOND TRAFFIC: SMART CITY CHALLENGE COMPETITIVE GRANT OPPORTUNITY

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) has issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity for the Beyond Traffic: Smart City Challenge Grant for mid-sized cities with existing transit systems; and

WHEREAS, by this grant, USDOT hopes to improve the safety and enhance the mobility of surface transportation in cities, and address climate change, by utilizing advanced data and intelligent transportation systems technologies and applications; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cleveland is one of sixty-four cities included in the mid-sized city criteria for the grant; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority is the primary public transit provider in the City of Cleveland and in Cuyahoga County; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority supports the efforts of the City of Cleveland and the USDOT to improve surface transportation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority:

Section 1. That the General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer is hereby authorized to support the City of Cleveland's application as required and to execute agreements on behalf of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority with the City of Cleveland for the Beyond Traffic: Smart City Challenge Grant.

Section 2. That the General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer is authorized to furnish such additional information as the City of Cleveland and USDOT may require in connection with this application.

Section 3. That the General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority is authorized to accept the funds resulting from the USDOT Beyond Traffic: Smart City Challenge Grant.

Section 4. That, in the absence of the General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer, the Acting General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority is hereby authorized to perform any and all of the above-described functions.

Section 5. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

- 1.0 PURPOSE/SCOPE: This action will allow the Authority to support the grant application of the City of Cleveland for the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) Beyond Traffic: Smart City Challenge Grant.
- 2.0 DESCRIPTION/JUSTIFICATION: On December 7, 2015 the USDOT issued a Notice of Funding Availability for the Beyond Traffic: Smart City Challenge Competitive Grant Opportunity. The City of Cleveland is one of sixty-four cities which meets the size criteria for the grant which also requires that the city have an existing public transit system. The City of Cleveland and GCRTA are working together to prepare our "Vision for a Smart City." If the application is successful, the grant funds will significantly upgrade the City of Cleveland and GCRTA technology and ability to communicate across a number of platforms.
