Resolution No. 1981-207

AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION FOR A MANAGEMENT DEVELOPMENT TRAINING PROGRAM WITH THE URBAN MASS TRANSPORTATION ADMINISTRATION AND THE CLEVELAND FOUNDATION AND AUTHORIZING AN EXPENDITURE IN SUPPORT THEREOF

WHEREAS, a survey of the Authority's management and supervisory personnel has identified specified professional development needs; and

WHEREAS, a proposal for Management Development Training has been prepared to fulfil those needs over a two-year period; and

WHEREAS, the total cost of said proposal for courses, fees, workshops and tuition is \$80,270.00, of which 75% (\$60,202.50) may be Federally funded under Section 10 of the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Cleveland Foundation has shown an interest in funding a portion of the remaining local share (\$20,067.50) of this program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

- Section 1. That the General Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file an application on the Authority's behalf with UMTA for a grant, under Section 10 of the UMT Act of 1964, as amended, for a Management Development Training program.
- Section 2. That the General Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all documents which may be required by UMTA in conjunction with the abovementioned application.
- Section 3. That a copy of the abovementioned application be submitted to the Cleveland Foundation for their consideration and possible partial funding.

Section 4. That of the total cost of the project (\$80,270.00), 75% (\$60,202.50) will be Federally funded. Of the remaining local share, an expenditure of that portion of the local share not funded by the Cleveland Foundation, not to exceed \$20,067.50, is hereby authorized.

Section 5. That this Resolution take effect immediately upon its adoption by the Board of Trustees.
