RESOLUTION NO. 1986-274

AUTHORIZING THE GENERAL MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH ROBERT P. MADISON INTERNATIONAL, INC., TO FURNISH ARCHITECT/ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE REHABILITATION OF BROOKLYN AND WOODHILL BUS GARAGES, PROJECT 17. EXPENDITURE NOT TO EXCEED \$1,004,050.00 (Capital Improvement Fund - OH-05-0025; Brooklyn Garage - \$488,330.00; Woodhill Garage - \$515,720.00).

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 1983-233, adopted September 20, 1983, provided notification for the need for professional services and the submission of proposals for the architect/engineering services required for rehabilitation of bus garages.

WHEREAS, pursuant to that Resolution, a request for proposal for architect/engineering services was issued November 15, 1984; and

WHEREAS, proposals were received from five (5) companies; and

WHEREAS, the proposal dated January 7, 1985, submitted by Madison-Madison International was determined to be the best and most qualified by virtue of the evaluation-process; and

WHEREAS, as a result of that evaluation, the Board of Trustees authorizes the General Manager to commence negotiations with Madison-Madison International per Resolution No. 1985-137;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the proposal of Madison-Madison received on the 7th day of January, 1985, for the architect/engineering services involving a total expenditure of not to exceed \$1,004,050.00 be and the same is hereby approved as the lowest and best responsive proposal.

- Section 2. That the General Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Robert P. Madison International, Inc., for the furnishing of architect/engineering professional services consistent with its proposal of January 7, 1985.
- Section 3. That said contract shall provide for an expenditure of 80% UMTA funds under Capital Improvement Grant OH-05-0025.

Section 4. That said contract shall be binding upon and an obligation of the Authority contingent upon compliance by the contractor to the Bid Specification and Addenda, if any; the Affirmative Action Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees in Resolution 1985-87; bonding, insurance requirements and all applicable laws relating to the contractual obligations of the Authority.
