

RESOLUTION 1988-85

AUTHORIZING A THREE (3) YEAR CONTRACT WITH YELLOW CAB COMPANY OF CLEVELAND FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION AND OPERATION OF CIRCULATOR TRANSIT SERVICE IN THE CLEVELAND FLATS AND DOWNTOWN (ESTIMATED ANNUAL COST \$74,719.00, TOTAL \$224,157.00 FOR THREE YEARS GENERAL FUND, OPERATIONS DIVISION).

WHEREAS, proposals were received on January 29, 1988, to provide for the Implementation and Operation of Circulator Transit Service in the Cleveland Flats and Downtown, for a three (3) year period, and

WHEREAS, the proposals were properly evaluated in accordance with the criteria set forth in the request for proposals, and Part 15 of the F.A.R.; and

WHEREAS, the proposal submitted by Yellow Cab Company of Cleveland was determined to be the best and most responsive to the needs of the Authority.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the proposal submitted by Yellow Cab Company of Cleveland be and it is hereby approved at the best and most responsive proposal for the Implementation and Operation of Circulator Transit Service in the Cleveland Flats and Downtown.

Section 2. That the General Manager of the Authority be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a three (3) year contract with Yellow Cab Company of Cleveland for the Implementation and Operation of Circulator Transit Services in the Cleveland Flats and Downtown at an annual cost estimated to be Seventy Four Thousand Seven Hundred and Nineteen and 00/100 Dollars (\$224,157.00), for three years.

Section 3. That said contract shall incorporate and be consistent with the proposal of Yellow Cab Company of Cleveland and the RFP issued on December 23, 1987, both as amended by negotiation and the Authority's general terms and conditions.

Section 4. That said contract shall be payable from the General Fund.


Section 5. That the General Manager shall report to the Operations Committee of the Board of Trustees prior to the start of this service and regularly thereafter on evaluation of said service, to include issues of revenues, amount of subsidy, security, and maintenance of vehicles, with a complete evaluation by the Operations Committee at the end of one year.

Section 6. That said contract is subject to UMTA approval.

Section 7. That said contract shall be binding upon and an obligation of the Authority contingent upon compliance by the contractor with the terms of the negotiated agreement and the Affirmative Action Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees in Resolution 11985-87; bonding and insurance requirements, and all applicable laws relating to the contractual obligations of the Authority.

Section 8. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
