

RESOLUTION NO. 1988-156

AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH URS CONSULTANTS FOR PROJECT 1.62A - ENGINEERING INSPECTION AND REPORT SERVICES FOR GCRTA TRACK BRIDGES (NOT TO EXCEED \$110,224.00 - GENERAL FUND) CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT AND ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT BUDGET.

WHEREAS, the proposal of URS Consultants received on the 10th day of March, 1988, provides for the furnishing of Track Bridge Engineering Inspection and Report Services, Project 1.62A, at a total estimated cost not to exceed One Hundred Ten Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-Four & 00/100 (\$110,224.00) Dollars; and

WHEREAS, all proposals received by the Authority were considered and evaluated; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the General Manager that the proposal submitted by URS Consultants be approved as the best and most qualified to meet the needs of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, a cost analysis was performed and the price negotiated was found to be reasonable;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the proposal submitted by URS Consultants on March 10, 1988, be and the same is hereby approved as the best and most responsive proposal for the furnishing of Track Bridge Engineering Inspection and Report Services to the Authority.

Section 2. That the General Manager of the Authority be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with URS Consultants to provide Track Bridge Engineering Inspection and Report Services at a cost plus fixed fee not to exceed One Hundred Ten Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-Four & 00/100 (\$110,224.00) Dollars.

Section 3. That said contract shall incorporate and be consistent with the proposal of URS Consultants dated March 10, 1988.


Section 4. That said contract shall be payable from the General Fund.

Section 5. That said contract is subject to UMTA approval.

Section 6. That said contract shall be binding upon and an obligation of the Authority contingent upon compliance by the contractor to the Bid Specification and Addenda, if any; the Affirmative Action Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees in Resolution 1985-87; bonding and insurance requirements and all applicable laws relating to the contractual obligations of the Authority.

Section 7. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
