

RESOLUTION NO. 1989-49

AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH SOUTHERN COACH
PARTS COMPANY FOR THE FURNISHING OF COACH WIRING
HARNESS ASSEMBLIES AS REQUIRED FOR ONE (1) YEAR
(EST. \$159,000.96 - GENERAL FUND)
INVENTORY DEPARTMENT BUDGET

WHEREAS, the bid of Southern Coach Parts Company for the furnishing of Coach Wiring Harness Assemblies was received on the 4th of April, 1989, for the price set forth in said bid, involving an estimated expenditure of One Hundred Fifty-Nine Thousand & 96/100 (\$159,000.96) Dollars;

WHEREAS, the General Manager deems the bid of Southern Coach Parts Company to be the lowest and best responsive bid from a responsible bidder and recommends acceptance thereof by the Board of Trustees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the bid of Southern Coach Parts Company be and the same is hereby accepted as the lowest and best responsive bid from a responsible bidder.

Section 2. That the General Manager of the Authority be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Southern Coach Parts Company for the furnishing of Coach Wiring Harness Assemblies for a period of one (1) year.


Section 3. That said contract shall be payable out of the General Fund in an estimated amount not to exceed One Hundred Fifty-Nine Thousand & 96/100 Dollars (\$159,000.96).

Section 4. That said contract is subject to UMTA approval.

Section 5. That said contract shall be binding upon and an obligation of the Authority contingent upon compliance by the contractor to the Bid Specification and Addenda, if any; the Affirmative Action Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees in Resolution 1985-87; bonding and insurance requirements and all applicable laws relating to the contractual obligations of the Authority.

Section 6. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
