RESOLUTION NO. 2000 - 18

AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT NO. 99121 WITH NELSON AUTOGROUP FOR THE PURCHASE OF ONE (1) CAB & CHASSIS VEHICLE WITH EQUIPMENT AS SPECIFIED THROUGH THE STATE OF OHIO COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM AT A TOTAL COST OF \$45,675.00; RTA CAPITAL FUND – BUS EQUIPMENT DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees authorized utilization of The State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program in Resolution 1990-69; and

WHEREAS, the Cooperative Purchasing Act provides political subdivisions within the State of Ohio with the opportunity to participate in contracts executed by the State of Ohio, Department of Administrative Services, Office of State Purchasing, for the purchase of supplies, services, equipment and certain materials; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code, Section 306.43 (H) (4), permits trustees of a regional transit authority to enter into agreements with the state to participate in said Program; and

WHEREAS, the General Manager has deemed it in the best interest of the Authority to utilize the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program for the purchase of one (1) Cab and Chassis with the required and specified equipment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the General Manager of the Authority be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Nelson Autogroup for the purchase of one cab & chassis vehicle, as required and as specified.

Section 2. That said contract is entered into under the authority granted by the Ohio Revised Code, Section 306.43 (H) (4).

Section 3. That said contract shall be payable from GCRTA Capital Fund, Bus Equipment Department, in an amount of forty five thousand six hundred seventy five and 00/100 dollars (\$45,675.00).

Section 4. That said contract shall be binding upon and an obligation of the Authority contingent upon compliance by the contractor to the Specifications and Addenda, if any; the Affirmative Action Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees in Resolution 1999-114; bonding and insurance requirements and all applicable laws relating to contractual obligations of the Authority.

Section 5. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
