

RESOLUTION NO. 2000 - 91

AUTHORIZING CONTRACT 2000-106 WITH BOISE CASCADE OFFICE PRODUCTS TO PROVIDE XEROGRAPHIC PAPER AS REQUIRED FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR, THROUGH THE STATE OF OHIO COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM AT A PRICE NOT TO EXCEED \$58,261.00 (GENERAL FUND - SUPPORT SERVICES DEPARTMENT BUDGET)

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Act provides political subdivisions within the State of Ohio with the opportunity to participate in contracts executed by the State of Ohio, Department of Administrative Services, Office of Purchasing, for the purchase of supplies, services, equipment and certain materials; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code, Section 306.43 (H) (4) permits the Trustees of the Regional Transit Authority to enter into agreements with the state; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees authorized utilization of the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program in Resolution 1990-69; and

WHEREAS, the General Manager has deemed it to be in the best interest of the Authority to utilize the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program for the purchase of xerographic paper.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the General Manager of the Authority be and he hereby is authorized to enter into a contract with Boise Cascade Office Products located at 1331 Boltonfield Street, Columbus, Ohio 43228 for the furnishing of xerographic paper, as required, for a period of one year as specified in State Term Schedule OT910800-P of the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program.

Section 2. That said contract shall be payable out of the RTA General Fund, Support Services Department Budget, at a price not to exceed fifty eight thousand two hundred sixty one and 00/100 dollars (\$58,261.00).


Section 3. That said contract shall be binding upon and an obligation of the Authority contingent upon compliance by the contractor to the Specification and Addenda, if any; the Affirmative Action Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees in Resolution 2000-065; bonding and insurance requirements and all applicable laws relating to the contractual obligations of the Authority.

Section 4. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
