AUTHORIZING SOLE SOURCE CONTRACT 2002-077 WITH PANDROL USA FOR 36,000 TIE PLATE SETS FOR THE TRACK REHABILITATION OVERHAUL PROJECT AT A PRICE OF \$511,740.00 – RTA DEVELOPMENT FUND, RAIL DISTRICT DEPARTMENT BUDGET.

WHEREAS, the offer of Pandrol USA, located at 501Sharpton Road, Bridgeport, NJ 08014, to furnish 36,000 tie plate sets for the Authority's track rehabilitation project was received by the Authority on July 30, 2002; and

WHEREAS, after negotiations, Pandrol USA, Inc., agreed to provide the tie sets for a total price of \$511,740.00; and

WHEREAS, Section 306.43(H)(2) of the Ohio Revised Code provides that competitive bidding is not required when a regional transit authority, after reasonable inquiry, determines that only one source of supply is reasonably available; and

WHEREAS, Pandrol USA, has proprietary rights to the Pandrol Tie Plate System currently in use on the Authority's rail system; and

WHEREAS, the General Manager deems the offer of Pandrol USA, as negotiated, to be fair and reasonable and recommends acceptance thereof by the Board of Trustees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the General Manager of the Authority be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Pandrol USA, for the furnishing of 36,000 tie sets for the Authority's track overhaul project, as specified.

Section 2. That said contract shall be payable from the RTA Development Fund, Rail District Department Budget, including but not limited to Capital Grant OH-90-X387 in the amount of \$511,740.00, (\$409,392.00 in Federal Funds, which represents 80% of the total cost).

Section 3. That the terms of such contract shall be consistent with the offer of Pandrol USA, as negotiated.

Section 4. That said contract shall be binding upon and an obligation of the Authority contingent upon compliance by the contractor to the Specification and Addenda, if any; the Affirmative Action Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees in Resolution 2002-120; bonding and insurance requirements and all applicable laws relating to the contractual obligations of the Authority.

Section 5. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

- 1.0 PURPOSE/SCOPE: This action will allow the Authority to enter into a contract with Pandrol USA for 36,000 tie plate sets.
- 2.0 DESCRIPTION/JUSTIFICATION: As part of the Track Rehabilitation Overhaul Project, the tie plates are used on the Authority's rail system to secure and provide stability of the rail to the crossties. This system is a safety sensitive part because a failure of one of these units may result in the derailment of the vehicle.
- 3.0 PROCUREMENT BACKGROUND: This is a sole source procurement as authorized by Section 306.43(H)(2) of the Ohio Revised Code. Pandrol USA holds the exclusive rights to this product. An industry survey showed that no other manufacturer provides a comparable product. The Procurement Department requested a proposal from Pandrol USA; after negotiations, the price of \$ 511,740.00 was agreed upon. A cost and price analysis was performed and the Procurement Department has determined the negotiated price to be fair and reasonable to the Authority.
- 4.0 DBE/AFFIRMATIVE ACTION BACKGROUND: All Affirmative Action requirements have been met. A 0% DBE goal was established for this procurement due to the unavailability of subcontracting opportunities.
- 4.0 POLICY IMPACT: Does not apply
- 6.0 ECONOMIC IMPACT: This procurement will be payable from the RTA Development Fund, Rail District Department budget, including but not limited to Capital Grant OH-90-X387, Line Item 12.7A.00 (\$409,392.00 in Federal Funds, which represents 80% of the total cost)
- 7.0 ALTERNATIVES: Reject this offer. Rejection of this offer may potentially cause the unsafe operation of the rail system and adversely affect the safety of riders and operators.
- 8.0 RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the offer of Pandrol USA be accepted and the resolution passed authorizing the General Manager to enter into a contract.
