## **RESOLUTION 2003-** 096

AUTHORIZING CONTRACT NO. 2003-024C WITH CLEVELAND CLINIC HEALTH SYSTEM, INC./CENTER FOR CORPORATE HEALTH TO PROVIDE SPECIMEN COLLECTION SERVICES, AS REQUIRED, FOR A PERIOD OF THREE YEARS WITH TWO ADDITIONAL ONE YEAR OPTIONS AT A BASE AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$46,500.00 (RTA GENERAL FUND, OFFICE OF BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT BUDGET).

WHEREAS, the Authority is required to conduct drug and alcohol specimen testing on all applicants and employees in order to meet Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration regulations and GCRTA policies; and

WHEREAS, the offer of Cleveland Clinic Health System/Center for Corporate Health with a location at 12300 McCracken Road, Garfield Heights, Ohio 44125 to provide specimen collection services, as required, for a period of three years with two (2) one-year options, was received on April 1, 2003; and

WHEREAS, after negotiations, a fixed fee schedule for services, as required, at a total price for the base period not to exceed forty-six thousand, five hundred and 00/100 dollars (\$46,500.00) for a period of three years with two (2) one-year options was agreed upon; and

WHEREAS, the General Manager deems the offer of Cleveland Clinic Health System/Center for Corporate Health, after negotiations, to provide specimen collection services, as required, for a period of three years with two (2) one-year options, to be advantageous to the Authority and recommends acceptance thereof by the Board of Trustees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the offer of Cleveland Clinic Health System/Center for Corporate Health, as modified by negotiations, to provide specimen collection services, as required, for a period of three years with two (2) one-year options, be and the same is hereby accepted as in the best interest of the Authority.

Section 2. That the General Manager of the Authority be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Cleveland Clinic Health System/Center for Corporate Health to provide specimen collection services, as required, for a period of three years with two (2) one-year options.

Section 3. That said contract shall be payable from the RTA General Fund, Office of Business Development Department budget in an amount not to exceed forty-six thousand, five hundred and 00/100 dollars (\$46,500.00) for the base three years.

Section 4. That said contract shall be binding upon and an obligation of the Authority contingent upon appropriation of funds for future years; compliance by the contractor to the Specifications and Addenda, if any; the Affirmative Action Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees in Resolution 2002-120; bonding and insurance requirements, future years funding and all applicable laws relating to contractual obligations of the Authority.

Section 5. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

- 1.0 PURPOSE/SCOPE: This action will allow the Authority to enter into a three year contract with two (2) one-year options with Cleveland Clinic Health System/Center for Corporate Health to provide specimen collection services, as required.
- 2.0 DESCRIPTION/JUSTIFICATION: This action will allow the Authority to continue to screen applicants and employees, as required, and to meet Federal guidelines for drug and alcohol specimen collection. In order to provide the Authority with multiple screening locations, this portion of the procurement has been divided into three equal contracts.
- 3.0 PROCUREMENT BACKGROUND: Requests for Proposal were sent to six potential vendors. Four proposals were received on April 1, 2003 for this solicitation. After evaluation by a panel of Authority employees in accordance with established Procurement Policies and Procedures and negotiations, the proposal of Cleveland Clinic Health System/Center for Corporate Health was determined to be one of the three most advantageous to the Authority to provide specimen collection services. The not to exceed price of \$46,500.00 for the base three year period is based upon the anticipated usage of these services at the pre-determined, negotiated rates. The Cleveland Clinic/Center for Corporate Health represents Lutheran, Lakewood, Fairview, Marymount, Euclid and South Pointe Hospitals as well as Lakewood Urgent Care. Clients include Phillips Electronics, Gibraltar Strip Steel, Inc. and Northem Stamping Company, Inc.

A cost analysis was performed and the Procurement Department has determined the negotiated rates to be fair and reasonable to the Authority.

- 4.0 DBE/AFFIRMATIVE ACTION BACKGROUND:All Affirmative Action requirements have been met. A 0% DBE goal was established for this procurement due to the lack of subcontracting opportunities.
- 5.0 POLICY IMPACT: Does not apply.
- 6.0 ECONOMIC IMPACT: That said contract shall be payable from the RTA General Fund, Office of Business Development Department budget at a total amount not to exceed forty-six thousand five hundred and 00/100 dollars (\$46,500.00), as required, for the base three year period. This is the budgeted amount for this project and is based upon anticipated usage.

- 7.0 ALTERNATIVES: Reject all proposals. Rejection of this offer would put the Authority at risk of being non-compliant with the Federal regulations, as set forth by the Department of Transportation for drug testing in the workplace.
- 8.0 RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the proposal of Cleveland Clinic Health System/Center for Corporate Health be accepted and the resolution passed authorizing the General Manager to enter into a contract.
- 9.0 ATTACHMENTS: None.
