AUTHORIZING CONTRACT NO. 2005-100 WITH WOOSTER IRON & METAL COMPANY FOR THE SALE OF TWENTY NINE USED TRANSIT VEHICLES IN "AS IS" CONDITION FOR A TOTAL SALE PRICE OF \$30,536.54.

WHEREAS, twenty nine (29) used transit vehicles have been determined to be obsolete in accordance with the Authority's vehicle replacement policy and have been declared excess and will be disposed of in accordance with the Authority's property disposal procedure; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Revised Code, Section 306.43(K) provides that a regional transit authority shall make a sale or other disposition of property through full and open competition; and

WHEREAS, the bid of Wooster Iron & Metal Company located at 972 Old Columbus Road, Wooster, Ohio 44691 for the purchase of said vehicles was received on August 25, 2005 for a total sale price of thirty thousand five hundred thirty-six & 54/100 dollars (\$30,536.54); and

WHEREAS, the General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer deems the bid of Wooster Iron & Metal Company to be the highest responsive bid from a responsible bidder for the items identified in Attachment A, hereto and recommends acceptance thereof by the Board of Trustees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the bid of Wooster Iron & Metal Company for the purchase of twenty nine (29) used transit vehicles as listed on Attachment A, hereto be and the same is hereby accepted as the highest responsive bid from a responsible bidder.

Section 2. That the General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer of the Authority be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Wooster Iron & Metal Company for the sale of twenty nine (29) used transit vehicles at a price of one thousand fifty-two & 98/100 dollars (\$1,052.98) each for a total of thirty thousand five hundred thirty six & 54/100 dollars (\$30,536.54) as listed on Attachment A, hereto on such terms as are in the best interest of the Authority.

Section 3. That proceeds of said sale in the amount of thirty thousand five hundred thirty-six & 54/100 dollars (\$30,536.54) be deposited into the General Fund.


Section 4. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

- 1.0 PURPOSE: This action will allow the Authority to enter into a contract for the sale of twenty-nine (29) used transit vehicles.
- 2.0 DESCRIPTION/JUSTIFICATION: The transit vehicles, as identified, in Attachment A to the resolution, have exceeded the useful life criteria established by the Authority's Vehicle Replacement Policy and FTA regulations. These vehicles range in age from 13 to 15 years. These vehicles have deteriorated to such a degree that the cost to return them to a safe and reliable condition would far exceed their value. It is recommended that these vehicles not be repaired, but sold on an "as is" basis.
- 3.0 PROCUREMENT BACKGROUND: Ohio Revised Code, Section 306.43(K) authorizes the sale and disposition of property through full and open competition.

Solicitation notifications were sent to 36 companies and/or individuals. Six bids were received on August 25, 2005 for this sale as listed below. An analysis was performed and the purchase price of Wooster Iron & Metal Company for the twenty-nine (29) used transit vehicles at an average unit price of \$1052.98 is considered fair and reasonable to the Authority.

- 4.0 AFFIRMATIVE ACTION/DBE BACKGROUND: The Office of Business Development does not conduct Affirmative Action reviews or establish goals on RTA procurements involving auction services or the sale of scrap or obsolete items.
- 5.0 POLICY IMPACT: This disposal is consistent with the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority's Vehicle Replacement Policy and the Procurement Policy regarding the sale or disposal of property.
- 6.0 ECONOMIC IMPACT: The proceeds of said sale will be deposited into the General Fund at a total sale price of thirty thousand five hundred thirty-six & 54/100 dollars (\$30,536.54).
- 7.0 ALTERNATIVES: <u>Reject all bids</u>. Rejection of all bids will delay the sale of these used transit vehicles and cause the Authority to incur additional costs in handling and storage of these vehicles.
- 8.0 RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the bid of Wooster Iron & Metal Company be accepted and the resolution passed authorizing the General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer to enter into a contract.
