

RESOLUTION NO. 2005- 128

AUTHORIZING CONTRACT NO. 2005-116 WITH MOTOROLA, INC., FOR THE PURCHASE OF GCRTA TRANSIT POLICE RADIO EQUIPMENT, AS SPECIFIED, THROUGH THE STATE OF OHIO COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM AT A TOTAL COST OF \$688,790.00 (RTA DEVELOPMENT FUND – TRANSIT POLICE DEPARTMENT BUDGET).

WHEREAS, the Authority has identified the need for radio equipment to facilitate the move by the Transit Police to the Ohio MARCS (Multi-Agency Radio Communications System); and

WHEREAS, such services are available from Motorola, Inc. located at 12955 Snow Road, Parma, Ohio 44130 through the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program; and

WHEREAS, the Cooperative Purchasing Act provides political subdivisions within the State of Ohio with the Opportunity to participate in contracts executed by the State of Ohio, Department of Administrative Services, Office of State Purchasing, for the purchase of supplies, services, equipment and certain materials; and

WHEREAS, Section 306.43(H)(4) of the Ohio Revised Code permits trustees of a Regional Transit Authority to participate in said program; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees authorized utilization of the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program in Resolution No. 1990-69; and

WHEREAS, the General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer has deemed it in the best interest of the Authority to utilize the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program for the purchase of GCRTA Transit Police radio equipment, as specified.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the offer of Motorola, Inc. through the Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program to provide radio equipment for GCRTA Transit Police, as specified, is hereby accepted.

Section 2. That the General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer of the Authority be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Motorola, Inc. to provide radio equipment for the Transit Police, as specified.


Section 3. That said contract is entered into under the authority granted by the Ohio Revised Code, Section 306.43(H)(4).

Section 4. That said contract shall be payable from the RTA Development Fund, Transit Police Department budget, including but not limited to Capital Grant OH-03-0245 and 100% Local Funds, in the amount of \$688,790.00 (\$519,032.00 in Federal funds which represents 78% of the total cost). The 2004 UASI Grant Program will reimburse up to \$40,000.00 of the 100% Local Funds share.

Section 5. That said contract shall be binding upon and an obligation of the Authority contingent upon compliance by the contractor to the Specifications and Addenda thereto, if any, the Affirmative Action Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees in Resolution 2005-51, bonding and insurance requirements and all applicable laws relating to contractual obligations of the Authority.

Section 6. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

1.0 PURPOSE/SCOPE: This action will allow the Authority to enter into a contract with Motorola, Inc. for radio equipment for the Transit Police, as specified, from the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program. This equipment will allow for Transit Police participation in the Ohio MARCS (Multi-Agency Radio Communications System) communications program.

2.0 DESCRIPTION/JUSTIFICATION: Ohio MARCS is the organization that provides radio communications for the State of Ohio (Ohio Highway Patrol, Turnpike Commission, Correctional Facilities, etc.). They operate over 200 tower sites throughout the state, with 8 towers covering Cuyahoga County and provide proven and excellent communications coverage. Transit Police coverage requirements exceed the capabilities of the Siemens system. The Ohio MARCS system also allows for interoperability between law enforcement agencies throughout the state. The interoperability is being encouraged by both the Federal and State governments. The City of Cleveland, as well as, Cuyahoga County Emergency Management Services are looking at the feasibility of creating an interoperability system for the Greater Cleveland area. However, it is anticipated that if that system is created, it will not be operational until 2010. At that time, should the Authority wish to participate in the Greater Cleveland system, the equipment being procured for the Ohio MARCS system will be compatible.


Most of the mobile radios provided by Siemens for Transit Police have been installed in the new SLF buses purchased by the GCRTA last year and the remainder will be installed as other new vehicles are placed in service.

3.0 PROCUREMENT BACKGROUND: The needed Transit Police radio equipment, listed in Attachment A – Equipment Listing, will be purchased through the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program at a total cost of \$688,790.00. In addition to this procurement, two (2) additional procurements will be presented in future months to facilitate the Transit Police moved to the Ohio MARCS system. One will be for Ohio MARCS tower upgrades needed to support GCRTA Transit Police. The other will be for the remainder of the Motorola equipment not found on the State Contract. These two (2) procurements are awaiting receipt of grant funding.

The Board of Trustees has authorized the General Manager/Secretary-Treasurer to utilize the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program by Resolution No. 1990-69. The price established under the state program is the result of a competitive solicitation and offered to all government entities. Under this contract the Authority will utilize federal grant funds, including Homeland Security, to assist in the funding of this purchase. All necessary federally required forms will be executed. A price analysis has been performed and the Procurement Department has determined the price to be fair and reasonable to the Authority.

- 4.0 AFFIRMATIVE ACTION/DBE BACKGROUND: The Office of Business Development does not conduct Affirmative Action reviews or establish goals on procurements included in the State Cooperative Purchasing program.
- 5.0 POLICY IMPACT: Does not apply.
- 6.0 ECONOMIC IMPACT: This contract shall be funded through the RTA Development Fund, Transit Police Department budget, including but not limited to Capital Grant OH-03-0245, Line Item 12.62.02 and 100% Local Funds at a cost of \$688,790.00 (\$519,032.00 in Federal funds which represents 78% of the total cost). The 2004 UASI Grant Program will reimburse up to \$40,000.00 of the 100% Local Funds share.
- 7.0 ALTERNATIVES: Reject this offer. Rejection of this offer would prevent the Authority's Transit Police from participating in the Ohio MARCS radio communications system and impede our Transit Police communication upgrade.
- 8.0 RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the offer of Motorola, Inc. be accepted and a resolution passed authorizing the General Manager/Secretary- Treasurer to enter into a contract.
