The meeting was called to order at 5:03 p.m. There were five (5) Committee members present.

It was advised that notice of this meeting had been posted more than twenty-four hours in advance of the meeting, that the usual notification had been given the news media and other interested persons, and that all requirements of the Ohio Revised Code and Rules and Bylaws of the Board of Trustees regarding notice of meeting had been complied with.

#### Approval of the July 30, 2024, COC Meeting Minutes

It was moved by Ms. Wharton and seconded by Mr. Taylor to approve the July 30, 2024 meeting minutes. There were 5 ayes, and none opposed, the motion carries.

#### **Executive Session Requested**

5:06 p.m. – it was moved by Ms. Wharton and seconded by Ms. Gordon that the committee enter executive session to enable the COC to conference with GCRTA attorneys for information-gathering, fact-finding, and to receive legal advice, and to consider the investigation of charges or complaints against a public employee, official, licensee or regulated individual. A Roll Call Vote was taken; Mr. Morris – Yes, Ms. Gordon – Yes, Ms. Auvil – Excused, Mr. Blake – Yes, Mr. England – Excused, Mr. Taylor – Yes, Ms. Wharton – Yes. The motion carries.

Ms. Auvil joined the meeting during executive session.

6:08 p.m. – It was moved by Ms. Wharton and seconded by Mr. Taylor to come out of executive session. A Roll Call Vote was taken; Mr. Morris – Yes, Ms. Gordon – Yes, Ms. Auvil – Yes, Mr. Blake – Yes, Mr. England – Excused, Mr. Taylor – Yes, Ms. Wharton – Yes. The motion carries.

#### Final Summary of Complaint Number C24-003

Mr. Morris asked for a motion for a finding on the first issue of Complaint #C24-003 of whether Acting Lt. Medlong threatened the complainant?

Ms. Gordon made a motion, seconded by Ms. Auvil, that the committee found Issue number 1 to be sustained.

A Roll Call vote was taken; Mr. Morris – Yes, Ms. Gordon – Yes, Ms. Auvil – Yes, Mr. Blake – Yes, Mr.

England – Excused, Mr. Taylor – No, Ms. Wharton – No. There were 4 ayes, the motion carries.

Mr. Morris asked for a motion for a finding on the second issue of Complaint #C24-003 on whether Acting Lt. Medlong acted unprofessionally in his interaction with the Complainant?

Ms. Auvil made a motion, seconded by Mr. Taylor, that the committee found Issue number 2 to be unsubstantiated.

A Roll Call vote was taken; Mr. Morris – Yes, Ms. Gordon – Yes, Ms. Auvil – Yes, Mr. Blake – Yes, Mr. England – Excused, Mr. Taylor – Yes, Ms. Wharton – Yes. There were 6 ayes, the motion carries.

Mr. Morris stated that the committee found other findings and concerns when reviewing the complaint, including:

- 1. Acting Lt. Medlong failed to activate his Body Worn Camera
- 2. Officer Thornsbury prematurely deactivated his Body Worn Camera.
- 3. Officer Wagner should have notified the oncoming shift supervisor of the complaint via email. Based on these additional findings Mr. Morris stated that the committee recommends that Acting Lt. Medlong and Officer Thornsbury receive remedial training on the Body Worn Camera policy and procedures. Further, Officer Wager, while properly de-escalating the call from the Complainant, needs to be reminded that the oncoming supervisor needs to be made aware of the complaint.

Ms. Gordon made a motion, seconded by Ms. Auvil, that the committee agree with the additional findings as written in the final summary C24-003.

A roll call vote was taken; Mr. Morris – Yes, Ms. Gordon – Yes, Ms. Auvil – Yes, Mr. Blake – Yes, Mr. England – Excused, Mr. Taylor – Yes, Ms. Wharton – Yes. There were 6 ayes, the motion carries.

For Issue number 2: Did the officers use excessive force in order to place the Complainant in handcuffs?

Ms. Gordon made a motion, seconded by Ms. Auvil, that the committee found Issue number 2 to be Unfounded.

- Not-sustained- The facts and circumstances fail to establish if the conduct occurred.
- Administratively Dismissed-The complaint is not GCRTA related, does not involve a Transit Police employee, or
  is related to a service delay that is determined to be unavoidable.
